Amendment HRC

5014

The purpose of this amendment is to provide the legislature with the authority to establish procedures and revoke or suspend rules and regulations.

A Vote For

Would allow the legislature to establish procedures to revoke or suspend rules and regulations that are adopted by state executive branch agencies and officials that have the force and effect of law.

A Vote Against

Would allow the state executive branch agencies and officials to continue adopting rules and regulations that have the force and effect of law without the opportunity for the legislature to directly revoke or suspend such rules and regulations.

Amendment HCR 5022

This amendment would preserve the right of citizens of each county that elected sheriff as of Jan 11th, 2022, to continue electing the county sheriff. The sheriff may be involuntarily removed from office pursuant to either a recall election or writ of quo warranto initiated by the attorney general.

A Vote for

Preserve the right of citizens of each county to continue to elect the county sheriff via popular vote. The sheriff may be involuntarily removed from office either a recall election or a writ of quo warranto initiated by the attorney general.

A Vote Against

Would not make any changes to the constitution and would retain current law concerning the election of sheriff and the procedures for involuntary removal
